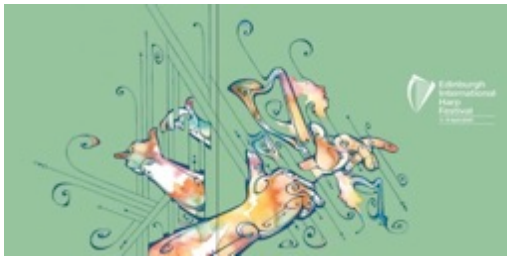

A NEW Evening Time Playing Group, Braithwaite near Keswick

HNW are supporting the establishment of new evening-time Playing Group in the north of Cumbria. Hopefully this will enable harpists who are not available during the daytime to play together with others. Everyone, whatever their experience and playing ability, will be welcome.

The group will meet initially on the second Wednesday of the month (mostly) at the Braithwaite Institute, Keswick from 6.30pm until 9pm, (playing from 7pm) from March 2020. Some HNW committee members will attend the initial sessions to ensure a welcome for everyone.

Dates: Weds 11th March, 15th April, 13th May, 10th June.

Revising the pieces from the 2020 HNW JaNEWary Challenge might be a good place to start!

After these initial sessions, which will be funded by HNW, the harpists can decide how they want to proceed. So far there are around 5 or 6 harpists expressing interest.

This year, in an effort to engage with the wider harp community, Harps North West have taken out membership with the **United Kingdom Harp Association (UKHA)**. Check out their website www.ukharp.net

- The UKHA exists to bring together all those interested in the harp, in all its forms, including amateur and professional players, teachers, and businesses providing services for the harp. It is run by unpaid volunteers.
- The UKHA publishes 'HARP' magazine: The twice-yearly members magazine keeps members informed of all the news in the harp world; reviews of new music, recordings, concerts and courses; features relevant and interesting articles on harp topics; provides advertising space for harp-related events and products and much more.
- They hold exciting harp events!
- The bursary scheme is open to all members. They also host performance opportunities to prize winners of the North London/Camac Harp Competition as well as performance/lecture opportunities prior to their AGM in London.
- They run an active website, where you can find up-to-date information, a useful members' area, and a rolling diary of harp events across the UK on the website, Facebook page and Twitter feed.

Ruth transitioned to harp from piano only two years ago, but brought a grace to the instrument usually only seen in more mature players.
